## **Course Description**

This course enables students to further develop their knowledge and skills in visual arts. Students will use the creative process to explore a wide range of themes through studio work that *may* include drawing, painting, sculpting, and printmaking, as well as the creation of collage, multimedia works, and works using emerging technologies. Students will use the critical analysis process when evaluating their own work and the work of others. The course may be delivered as a comprehensive program or through a program focused on a particular art form (e.g., photography, video, computer graphics, information design).

## **Essential Course Components**

To be successful in this course you must be able to demonstrate all of the following skills.

- CREATIVE PROCESS. Apply the creative process to create a variety of art works, individually and / or collaboratively
- ELEMENTS & PRINCIPLES OF DESIGN
  - Apply elements and principles of design to create art works for the purpose of self-expression and to communicate ideas, information and /or messages
- PRODUCTION & PRESENTATION
  - Produce art works, using a variety of media/materials and traditional and emerging technologies, tools, and techniques, and demonstrate an understanding of a variety of presenting their works and the works of others
- THE CRITICAL ANALYSIS PROCESS, ART, SOCIETY & VALUES
  - Demonstrate an understanding of how art works reflect the society in which they were created, and of how they can affect personal values. Demonstrate an understanding of the critical analysis process by examining, interpreting, evaluating, and reflecting on various art works
- CONNECTIONS BEYOND THE CLASSROOM
  - Describe opportunities and requirements for continued engagement in visual arts.
- TERMINOLOGY
  - Demonstrate an understanding of, and use correct terminology when referring to, elements, principles, and other components related to visual arts
- CONVENTIONS & TECHNIQUES
  - Demonstrate an understanding of conventions and techniques used in the creation of visual art works
- RESPONSIBLE PRACTICES
  - Demonstrate an understanding of responsible practices related to visual arts

#### **Procedures**

Late and Missing Assignments: It is important for students to develop good personal management skills (such as time management and planning). These skills will be reflected in the **learning skills** area of the report card. All of the above listed skills/assignments in the Essential Course Components checklist must be submitted and/or demonstrated in order to earn this credit.

**Attendance:** Attendance in classes and at home, is an important part of learning, and absences should be avoided. - 1. The student may be required to redo all or part of the assignment or assessment.
- 2. The student may be required to complete an alternate assignment or assessment.
- 3. The student's work may be treated as a missed assignment.

There may also be other consequences that are determined to be appropriate (e.g. detention, suspension, etc.) as per the school's progressive discipline process. Parents/guardians will be informed about the infraction and the consequences.
