Course Description

This course focuses on enabling students to refine their use of the creative process when creating and presenting two- and three-dimensional art works using a variety of traditional and emerging media and technologies. Students will use the critical analysis process to deconstruct art works and explore connections between art and society. The studio program enables students to explore a range of materials, processes, and techniques that can be applied in their own art production. Students will also make connections between various works of art in personal, contemporary, historical, and cultural contexts.

Demonstrate an understanding of the critical analysis process by examining, interpreting, evaluating, and reflecting on various art works
- CONNECTIONS BEYOND THE CLASSROOM Describe opportunities and requirements for continued engagement in visual arts.
- TERMINOLOGY
 Demonstrate an understanding of, and use correct terminology when referring to, elements, principles, and other components related to visual arts
- CONVENTIONS & TECHNIQUES Demonstrate an understanding of conventions and techniques used in the creation of visual art works
- RESPONSIBLE PRACTICES
 Demonstrate an understanding of responsible practices related to visual arts

Procedures

Late and Missing Assignments: It is important for students to develop good personal management skills (such as time management and planning). These skills will be reflected in the learning skills area of the report card. All of the above listed skills/assignments in the Essential Course Components checklist must be submitted and/or demonstrated in order to earn this credit.

Attendance: Attendance in classes and at home, is an important part of learning, and absences should be avoided. - 3. The student's work may be treated as a missed assignment.

There may also be other consequences that are determined to be appropriate (e.g. detention, suspension, etc.) as per the school's progressive discipline process. Parents/guardians will be informed about the infraction and the consequences.
